I really wish I could write about something other than Rain. Every time we get two or three dry days and the course begins to dry, the rains come again and take us back to square one. The milder weather and as I stated in my last report, the warm soils, means the growth has already begun in earnest. This is causing issues as there are still large parts of the course we cannot access. We are trying to cut as much as we can but the definition of fairways and rough is going to take some time and prolonged dry period to achieve. The forecast over the next two weeks is not great, we can only hope for some better luck.

The positive of the longer days and milder weather along with active plant growth is all of this increases the speed at which the course dries. But the drying needs to out pace the rainfall before maintenance and play can resume to expected spring/summer levels.

Paths



We again thank you for your patience and hope the course will start to take shape over the coming weeks ready for the main season start.






