LADIES SUMMER RUNNING COMPETITIONS

Information regarding summer running competitions for 2022:

- Sign up for all running competitions will be via BRS (by selecting the relevant competition in the competition tab scroll down to the bottom for Ladies summer running competitions)
- There are 5 competitions to enter:
 - Summer Eclectic £3 (18 holes) & £2 (9 holes)
 - Summer Knockout £3
 - Summer Running Weekend Competition £3
 - Hi-Low Foursomes £3
 - Daily Mail Foursomes £2 (sign up in pairs)
- Full details for each competition is included below
- These will be available to enter via BRS from 4th March until Wednesday 6th April 2022. Entry fees will be taken from the competition purse on Club V1.
- Draws will be available for play from Monday 11th April 2022 on club V1 (results of matches should be recorded on the knockout competitions section put details on as a reminder here?)

THE DAILY MAIL FOURSOMES COMPETITION

Leading to possible qualification for a regional heat of the Daily Mail Foursomes.

- A knockout foursomes competition played prior to the year of qualifying.
- Handicap allowance: 1/2 the difference of combined handicaps.
- Maximum handicap index of 30.
- The first round of the competition starts late April/early May and the final is to be completed by late October.
- Choose your own Partner sign up in pairs.
- Players under 18 on the 1st January are not eligible to enter
- Entry fee of £2.00

HI-LOW FOURSOMES' COMPETITION

The Anne Whitty Trays

Presented by Mrs F C Whitty in 1972

- The competition will be run every year commencing April and to be completed by the Autumn Meeting.
- A draw will be made for partners when entries are complete i.e. halving the field according to handicaps and making a draw.
- The dates between each round will be suitably spaced.
- All matches must be played within the dates stated.
- Handicap allowance: 1/2 of the difference of combined full handicaps.
- Junior Girls are not eligible for this competition.
- Entry fee is £3.00 per person.

ECLECTIC COMPETITIONS

(updated Spring 2020)

The May Hill Trophy

Presented by Mrs C P Hill in 1936

- Summer Eclectic runs from the first qualifying competition till the Final Fling inclusive.
- Winter Eclectic runs from November 1st to the last non-qualifying competition.
- Summer 9 hole Eclectic runs from the start of the qualifying season until the Final Fling and will include all 9 hole competitions, both qualifying and non-qualifying.
- There is no limit to the number of cards which may be submitted.
- A player may not enter both the 9 hole and 18 hole Eclectic.
- Only cards submitted in singles stroke play competitions are eligible for eclectic scores.
- Upper limit of 30 handicap index for the cup only. 5/8 of handicap will be deducted from the gross score in all Eclectic competitions.
- Entry fee is £3.00 for 18 holes and £2.00 for 9 holes and must be paid before commencing the first eclectic card.

SUMMER KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

May Barton Trophy

Presented by May Barton in 1957

- It is an 18-hole match-play competition.
- Handicap allowance: full difference.
- Upper limit of 30 handicap index for the cup only. Players with a handicap over 30 are eligible to play but must play off 30.
- The competition begins in April and runs through to September.
- A draw is made for the knock-out competition.
- Matches may be played at weekends.
- All matches must be played within the times stated.
- Entry fee £3.00

SUMMER WEEKEND RUNNING COMPETITION

(Updated March 2022)

- This competition, open to all ladies, will be played during the qualifying season on Saturdays.
- Ladies wanting to play in the Summer Weekend Running competition must have entered the competition via BRS during the booking window before 6th April. Payment of £3 is taken at this point, after which as many qualifying cards as desired can be entered during the Summer playing season up to Final Fling
- Players to sign up on BRS as dates are made available for booking (2 weeks in advance)
- A qualifying card for this competition can be entered on all weekends as listed in the Fixtures diary (most weekends except where there is a mixed honours board competition)
- A competitor can play in as many qualifying games as they wish, which are a mix of medal and Stableford, but **at least one medal** and **two Stableford competitions** will need to be played.
- As these games are part of the usual weekend games, cards will be entered on the computer in the usual way – but it is important that ladies declare that they are entering the Summer Weekend Competition.
- The winner of the competition will be the lowest score when the player's best 2 Stableford scores are taken away from her best net medal score.
